

What or who allows you to feel creative and powerful?

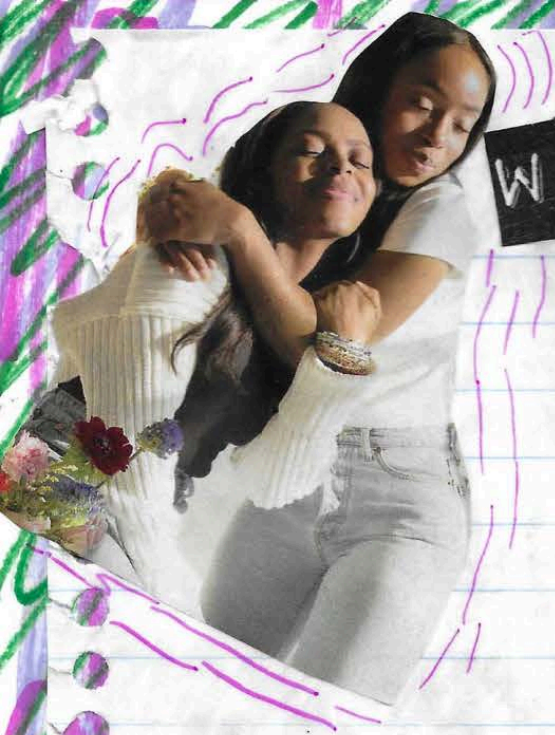
Does hope or fear play a greater role in the choices you make?

HERE ARE SOME WAYS YOU
CAN SPREAD ABUNDANCE
IN YOUR COMMUNITY

Host a viewing party and community conversation (public or private).

Learn about key issues impacting low-income people that local groups are seeking to address in your community.

Join and/or donate to local efforts organizing around economic justice issues (mutual aid, artists, activist groups, food banks, etc.). You can start by learning about grantees of the Emergent Fund and Trans Justice Funding Project or tenant associations in your community.

Use your creativity to imagine a world of abundance where everyone can be themselves. Draw, sing, paint, write or dance, and share your art with the people around you.

Create a community art project that shares a collective vision for an economically just world.

Share your artwork on social media and use the hashtag #WeAreAbundant.

Post a *We are Abundant* poster or sticker in your community to encourage others to dream and take action with you.

Start a class consciousness raising group to explore how your socioeconomic background and status impact your life and worldview.

Find inspirational sources that affirm your dreams of an economically just world (films, songs, stories, community spaces, etc.). Help us crowdsource inspiration for each other by sharing on social media and using the hashtag #WeAreAbundant.

Form dream circles with others to spend time dreaming and sharing your dreams of a different world and support each other in making that world a reality.

Explore your community and spend time reimagining how resources and spaces could be shared or used differently.

Host a zine making party with friends and community members to express a collective vision for an abundant world and distribute your zine throughout your community.
